# Checklist To Help You Tackle Your Move With Confidence

Embarking on a move to a new home is an exciting milestone, but it can also feel overwhelming with all the details to manage. Don't worry, though – we've got your back!

# One to Two Months Before Moving:

- Ocontact providers to schedule the shutdown of services and arrange set-up of services in your new home.
  - O Water and sewage treatment
  - O Internet and cable services
  - Electricity
  - O Natural gas or propane
  - Trash and recycling pickup
  - O Homeowner's or renters insurance
  - O Gardeners or landscapers
  - O Snow removal services
  - O Gym membership



- Provide your new address to ensure any remaining bills are sent to the correct location
- Schedule time off work
- Schedule childcare
- Take this opportunity to evaluate and schedule any necessary services for your new home in advance
- Transfer/set-up insurance
- Prepare a budget



## Provide Notice to Your Landlord or Homeowners Association

Most landlords require a notice period of 30 to 90 days. To ensure a smooth transition and potentially secure the return of your deposit, schedule a walk-through with your landlord before moving out.



#### **Moving Week:**

- Confirm your move with the chosen movers or rental companies
- Notify your neighbours if you'll be blocking shared driveways
- Secure Parking Permits
- O Confirm appointments for utilities and internet at your new place
- Clean your old place and pack personal essentials for easy
- Take pictures of your valuables
- Scan important documents
- Start emptying your fridge (eat up!)
- Label your boxes
- Make arrangements for the keys



#### The Day Before:

- O Give your neighbours a friendly heads-up about the move
- Ensure you have enough cash on-hand to tip movers or cover other expenses
- Pack a box with first-day move-in essentials
- O Defrost your freezer
- Keep an empty box nearby for miscellaneous items
- Have trash bags nearby, cleaning supplies handy
- Take a moment to treat yourself and relax before the big day




#### **Parking Permit**

Ensuring adequate parking arrangements on moving day is crucial for a smooth relocation process. Parking permits are commonly required in downtown and metropolitan areas, particularly high-rise living environments.

# Best Practices If You Are Packing Yourself

We highly recommend using Atlas' professional packing service for your china and other breakable items. However, if you decide to do some or all of your packing, these professional tips will help guide you through this task. Your Atlas Canada Agent can provide a complete range of cartons and packing materials at a reasonable cost.



#### **Good to Know**

Pack personal items, such as prescriptions, keys, glasses, sensitive documents, etc., with you and not in the moving van. Any high-value items over \$5000 must have written appraisals to be shipped on the moving van.

By law, a household goods mover cannot transport dangerous goods with your belongings for safety reasons. Many everyday items, such as household cleaners and propane, are prohibited in the moving van. For more information and a complete list of dangerous goods, please contact your local Atlas Agent.

#### **General Packing Tips:**

- Gather all your packing supplies, including various carton sizes, tissue paper, tape, scissors, pack labels, and markers.
- Allow yourself sufficient time to complete the job.
- Begin by packing the out-of-season items, then the seldomused items, and lastly, the things that will be used until the very last minute.
- Create a box labelled "set-up," which includes all the musthave items on move day, such as medication, toiletries, paper plates and utensils, bed sheets, clothing, etc.
- Place items within a carton and keep all parts or pairs together.
- Put curtain rod hardware, screws and bolts, and other small parts in a plastic bag and tape or tie it to the article.
- When filling a carton, do not exceed 50 lbs.; fill the box to the top to prevent crushing during transit, and ensure all cartons close flat.
- Be sure to back up all computer files. Disconnect all wiring and cables and draw a simple diagram or colour code before disconnecting to make reconnection easier.
- Dresser drawers can also be utilized for some light clothing, but all other items should be removed from them and packed in cartons.





#### Packing Your Breakables:

For these fragile items, you should use china cartons or sturdy, medium size cartons with 3"-4" of crumpled packing paper in the bottom of the carton for additional cushioning.

- Individually wrap each piece of glass, whether a plate, bowl, cup, etc. Stack 2-4 to a group (using your judgment) and wrap them again in a double layer of packing paper.
- Plates can form the bottom tier or layer of the carton, followed by bowls in the next layer and finally by cups, glassware, goblets and other light, fragile items.
- Separate each layer in the carton with a cushion of paper and ensure that each wrapped piece is snug in its layer to prevent movement.
- Fill empty space with crushed paper as well as hollow breakables.
- Use wooden crates and linens to protect mirrors, large pictures, glass table tops, etc.
- Mark the top of the carton with "Fragile" and "This Side Up".
